### **Frequently Asked Questions:**

**Q.** What is Grave of Thrones?

**A.** 'Grave of Thrones' is designed as a place for Game of Thrones fans to mourn the loss of their favourite characters and reflect on the more than hundred thousand individual deaths over the course of 67 episodes. It also marks the screening of the final season, exclusively on Foxtel.

**Q.** How big is the Grave of Thrones site?

**A.** More than 2,000 square metres.

**Q.** How many gravestones are there?

**A.** There are 34 headstones, monuments, statues and more.

**Q.** How long did they take to make?

**A.** From research to design to actually creating the Grave of Thrones site it's been around ten weeks working around the clock.

**Q.** How were the headstones made?

**A.** Each was hand sculpted from industrial-grade polystyrene, coated with a sandstone finish and painstakingly detailed with design elements like moss, rust, dirt to bring the spirit of Westeros to life.

**Q.** How many people worked on it?

**A.** It's been a huge and passionate team working on it, with more than 30 in construction alone, plus some of the best sculptors, designers and painters in Australia. And many more behind the scenes.

**Q.** What are some favourites?

**A.** Every grave is so layered in stories and reference, that they are all incredible for their own reasons. People will love the Family Mausoleums for their grandeur, Joffrey for his impact and divisiveness, and of course, Hodor, whose death everyone still can't watch without crying.

**Q.** What should people look out for when they visit?

**A.** Everything you'll see in the graveyard is there for a reason. So pay close attention to the details... Every tomb is layered in reference to the lives and deaths of the characters. Some hilarious, others more ominous. Like a dog bowl at the foot of Ramsay Bolton's tomb...
